# **Farmers Alliance Litigation**

MrdJ L Kiett Says That All Al leged Claims Must be Proved.

To the Editor of The State:

The decision of the supreme court dismissing the appeal irom Judge Gary's order, directing the master of Richland county to advertise for creditors and stock holders of the Farmers' Alliance exchange, appears to be based upon a question of fact raised by testimony that there are no creditors of the exchange, and the statement of Messrs M L Donaldson and J C Coit's attorney, who declined to submit proof of the alleged claims while Mr Donaldson was present at the reference.

I desire, for the benefit of the stockholders, who are numerous throughout the State, to refer to the following extracts of the report of the committee on litigation to the county trustees.

"The directors cannot recognize the claims of Donaldson and Coit as valid, and no others have been presented . . . . . . . . . . The directors have no desire to dishonor payment of any just claims . On the 26th of May testimony was taken by Mr John S Verner, master of Richland county . .

Mr M L Donaldson was present, but did not undertake to prove his claim . . . We say to you gentlemen that there are no creditors of the Farmers' Alliance exchange, and we will defeat any claims that are presented. We care not where or when alleged claimants file their claims the courts are open to them, but in justice to ourselves, in justice to you, and in protection of the bene ficiaries you represent, we protest against the stockholders filing their claims with the master."

A full meeting of the county trustees, to whom this report was made, adopted the following resolution unanimously:

"Resolved, third. In compliance with the request of the committee, we pledge ourselves not to file any claim in court unless it becomes necessary after final ad judication."

The master of Richland county advertised for claims, notwithstanding the appeal, but we have had no notice that Messrs. Donaldson and Coit wish to undertake to prove their claims. Their failure to meet the issue is the real obstruction. We are ready at all times to welcome and meet these alleged claims when an opportunity is offered, but we will resist an attempt to smuggle them through the court.


