Hero Of Cubu Libre Fights Did Not Poison Wife Says Last Battle.

Gen. Maximo Gomez Passes Away at Habana.-Honored By Adopted Country.

Habana, June 17 .- Gen, Maximo Gomez died at 6 o'clock this evening.

"El caudillo, (chieftain,) as the great lead r of revolutions will be called by his countrymen expired at sunset, in the presence of his family and his old-time friend Estrada Palma, president of the republic.

The end came quietly in the beautiful temporary home at the scaside in the suburb of Vedado, to which Gen. Gomez was taken on his return from Santiago President Palma accompanied by Gen. Andrade arrived about a quarter of an hour previous to the death of Gen. Gomez.

The distinguished patient' heart had weakened steadily since II o'clock in the morning and failed to respond to stimulants Several times during his long illness Gen. Gomez had shown recuperative powers that were astonishing. His real illness extended over 46 days, although his health had been failing for some months prior to that time.

The admiations of the mass o Cubans for Gen. Gomez amounted almost to idolatry. His death admittedly is a severe blow to any political interest to which he was allied. He was one of the most radical leaders party. He had allied himself with the Liberal fusion movement, but a split came during his sickness and it was generally thought he would have joined Gov. Nunez and other dissenters in upholding the old Nationalist organization.

Gen. Gomez leaves a widow, five sons and one daughter.

Her manner of speaking and the ease which she displayed before the large assemblage was striking At times her words caused tears to stream down the cheeks of the veterans, while at others the applause that went up was destening. She gave an eulogy on the beautiful sauthern woman and the chivalry of the southern gentleman.
