

> It was quite evident that he was laboring under intense nervousness, though he made a desperate effort to apper calm and collected. He first thanked the coroner and jury for postponing the inquest until he could attend the funeral of his brother. In answer to questions he declared that he had no further statement to make beyound what was contained in the note written by his brother and which was in evidence That was all that he would say and the awful details of the tragedy may remain for everlocked up in his breast.

Mr and Mrs E Keith Dargan, parents of the suicide, are very ill, made so by the terrible events of the past week. It is not expected that Mr Dargan will live.

It was rumored on the streets today that Keith Dargan would be taken to some sanitarium, the general opinion being that is what (ught to be done.
