Request Made for Appointment of Deputies to Enforce Law Against Carrying Concealed Weapons.

Aiken, Aug. 8 .- A committee representing the Aiken County Law and Order league called on the county commissioners yesterday afternoon in accordance with the resolution adopted concerning the carrying of concealed weapons at the fourth of July meeting of the league. They requested that the commissioners authorize the sheriff to appoint two deputies to enforce the law against carrying concealed weapons. Supervisor Brodie said that while he was in hearty sympathy with the league in this matter, ne could take no steps to grant their request as the county attorney had informed him that the commissioners had no authority to give any such instructions. Mr. Gunter a prominent attorney, who was present, said that the only way that money could be obtained to pay extra deputies would be by an act of the legislature.

The committee next called upon Sheriff Raborn, asking him if he would appoint two deputies to enforce the law against carrying concealed weapons, if the Law and Order league would guarantee the money for the extra salaries. He said that he would be glad to do so and asked the committee to suggest the deputies should they decide to have them appointed. The committee did nothing further yesterday, but it is thought that an effort will be made to secure an appropriation for the pay of the extra deputies at the next session of the legislature.

The league claims that the fines collected from the "pistol toters" would more than pay the additional officers.

Many Crushed to Death By Collapse of Store.

Hundred Men, Women and Children Buried in Ruins-Disaster in Albany.

Albany, N. Y., Aug. 8 .- The middle section of the big department store of the John G. Myers company on north Pearl street, collapsed early today, carrying down with it over 100 persons.

Caught in a chaos of brick, plaster and wooden beams, between 20 and 30 men, women and children met death. Twelve hours' frantic work on the part of rescuers disentangled 50 people, six of them dead and many of the rest badly injured. Three bodies were in sight at a late hour tonight, but many hours' work will be required to get them out. Anything like a complete list of the killed and injured will be unobtainable untill the workers have made their way to the very bottom of the mass of the wreckage. With few exception those caught in the ruins were employes, a large majority of them girls.


