The County Exemption Board for Oconee is still at work, giving careful, conscientious consideration to all claims for exemption. EXEMPTION BOARD WORK.

So far the Exemption Board has passed finally on 266 cases before them. Of these 149 have received exemption (some exemptions being only temporary), and 117 men have been finally accepted for service. This leaves the original draft list with following showing:

ITALIANS GO FORWARD AGAIN.

Latest Dispatches Contain Encouraging News for Entente Allies. New York, Aug. 21.—The Austrian line on the Isonzo front is beginning to bend and give way at various points under the furious attacks of the Italians, Rome announces officially. The Italians are making progress toward a success which, the statement says, is becoming delineated in spite of undiminished resistance by the Austrians. More than 10,000 prisoners have been taken in the new battle of the Isonzo, and strong Austrian defenses have fallen into the hands of the attackers. Unless the Austrians are able to rally their shattered forces, developments of far-reaching importance may follow quickly. The German reaction to the successful French stroke at Verdun came last night, and the new French lines stood firm in the face of counter attacks of extreme violence. On the front north of Verdun the fighting was particularly bitter, the French war office reports. The Germans, beaten back, met with heavy losses. The number of prisoners taken by the French now exceeds 5,000. Canadian troops around Lens, in Northern France, made another attack early this morning. Germans who advanced at the same time made a hurried retreat on encountering the Canadians, who captured 2,000 yards of German positions west and northwest of Lens. Heavy fighting is still in progress, with the Canadians having the upper hand. On the British front the Germans last night made their third attempt to recapture positions recently wrested from them near Epehy, northwest of St. Quentin. A determined attack was made in which the Germans employed flame throwers, but they were repulsed completely by the British.

TWO HUNDRED MORE CALLED.

Men Notified Last Saturday to Appear To-day and To-morrow.

The Oconee Exemption Board last Saturday, August 18th, sent notices to 200 more registered men to appear before them for examination. The 200 were divided into two squads, one to appear to-day (Wednesday), the second to appear to-morrow (Thursday), August 23d. Following is the list of those drawn:
