DEATH AND DESTRUCTION COME FOR THE CONTROL OF MOLES.

In Wake of Heavy Storm - Indiana Mole Traps Are Good, but Less Effective-Method for Poisoning.

> Clemson College, April 21,-Moles for a remedy:

> 1. Stir unparched peanuts in the white of egg! While sticky sprinkle Paris green over them. Mix well, so that the poison surrounds all the seed, and let dry. They will dry in about half an hour, and are then hard and can be easily handled.

> 2. Roll raisins in strychnine with a stick or toothpick. Do not use the hands, and be sure not to spill any, for it is a violent poison. When through, burn any poison remaining

> > How to Apply.

Whittle a broom handle to a point. Walk over the ground, and at intervals pierce the runway and drop into the hole a poisoned raisin or peanut, and cover with the foot.

Mole traps may be prchased at the hardware stores or wholesale houses, sonal but they are less effective, and only the poisoned traps are recommended.


