DEATH AND DESTRUCTION COME

In Wake of Heavy Storm—Indiana Felt Full Effects of Tornado.

Chicago, April 18.—Revised figures on the casualties and damage caused by the storm which swept over the Central States yesterday and last night to-day were 30 known dead—11 in Illinois, 17 in Indiana and two in Missouri, three or four hundred injured, and property damage running into millions of dollars.

Sweeping northeastward through the Middle Western States, a storm, which had its origin in the Rocky Mountain region Sunday, passed over Ohio to-day, leaving in its wake death and much destruction. A loss of nearly 50 lives was attributed to the storm, which developed considerable energy as it progressed over Illinois and Indiana, taking in many places the form of tornadoes. Damage to property will mount into millions, it is believed.

Accompanied by rains, which sent streams, already swollen, coursing far beyond their usual channels, the storm brought added suffering and inconvenience to some communities which for several days have been affected by flood conditions. A drop in the temperature to below seasonal normal added to the discomfort of families whose homes, having been destroyed by wind or made uninhabitable by floods, are now living in tents or improvised shelters.

Indiana apparently felt the full effect of the wind storms yesterday. In that State 21 persons are known to have met death in different communities. Early yesterday morning the storm centered in Illinois, striking a number of villages in the darkness the tornado wrought havoc to many homes, and such reports were available from agricultural communities which had been stripped of nearly all means of communication indicated that 22 persons had been killed.

Missouri, Iowa and Kansas had felt the storm early Sunday, but in these States it lacked the intensity which marked its sweep across Illinois and Indiana and into Ohio.

As it passed over Indiana there were two distinct tornado belts. The one in the southern part sustained some damage, but across the northern part of the State there was a wind-swept strip in which the loss of life was heavy. Warrensburg, in the western part of the State, reported a loss of twelve lives. Four met death in Madison county, in the central portion of the State.

The death toll was greatest in the central section of Illinois. The villages of Irvington and Plainfield, near Centralia, were badly wrecked and several persons were killed. Other fatalities in this State were in small rural communities.

Pay Income Tax by May 1.

Only a brief time remains for persons who paid Federal income taxes to pay their State income taxes—on or before May 1st being the date for the payment of the State income tax. The State Tax Commission has the list of all those who paid the Federal tax, according to announcement sent out from Columbia.

The State tax is 33 1-3 per cent (one-third) of the Federal tax, and by the collection of this tax the State expects to get in the neighborhood of one million dollars revenue for the running of the State government.

Rock Hill Stands by "Fatty."

A dispatch from Rock Hill, under date of April 15th, says:

"Police were called out Saturday night to handle the crowds seeking to gain entrance to a local theatre showing a picture of 'Fatty' Arbuckle. This was the first showing in this section of a picture made by the fat comedian since his arrest on a charge of causing the death of a motion picture actress last September. The crowds attending here established a record for attendance in this city, it being estimated that fifteen thousand were admitted.

FOR THE CONTROL OF MOLES.

Mole Traps Are Good, but Less Effective—Method for Poisoning.

Clemson College, April 21.—Moles generally pass through their runways several times a day, and the following methods have, therefore, been found effective in controlling them, says Prof. A. F. Conradi, entomologist, in answer to numerous requests for a remedy:

1. Stir unparched peanuts in the white of egg. While sticky sprinkle Paris green over them. Mix well, so that the poison surrounds all the seed, and let dry. They will dry in about half an hour, and are then hard and can be easily handled.

2. Roll raisins in strychnine with a stick or toothpick. Do not use the hands, and be sure not to spill any, for it is a violent poison. When through, burn any poison remaining over.

How to Apply.
Whittle a broom handle to a point. Walk over the ground, and at intervals pierce the runway and drop into the hole a poisoned raisin or peanut, and cover with the foot.

Mole traps may be prechased at the hardware stores or wholesale houses, but they are less effective, and only the poisoned traps are recommended.

ARBUCLE OFF BOARD FOR TIME

Being—Matter of His Suppression to Be Given Careful Consideration.

New York, April 19.—Cancellation of all contracts for the showing of films in which Roscoe C. (Fatty) Arbuckle appears, was announced tonight by Will H. Hays, head of the Motion Picture Producers' Association. This action, he said, affected nearly ten thousand contracts.

"After consultation with Nicholas Schenck, representing Jos. Schenck, the producers, and Adolph Zuker and Mr. Lasky, of the Famous Players-Lasky Corporation, the distributors," Mr. Hays' statement said, "I will state that, at my request, they have cancelled all showings and all bookings of the Arbuckle films. They do this that the whole matter may have the consideration that its importance warrants, and the action is taken notwithstanding the fact that they had nearly 10,000 contracts in force for the Arbuckle pictures."

When Mr. Zuker was asked if the action of the Producers' Association had removed Arbuckle definitely from the list of screen stars, he replied:

"We simply left the matter in the hands of Mr. Hays. It's up to him to decide in the future whether it will be proper to reintroduce the Arbuckle pictures."

Mr. Zuker said recently that three

Arbuckle feature comedies had been completed before the arrest of the comedian on charges growing out of the death of Miss Virginia Rappe. The producer announced shortly after Arbuckle's acquittal that one of the films would be released as a "test of public opinion."

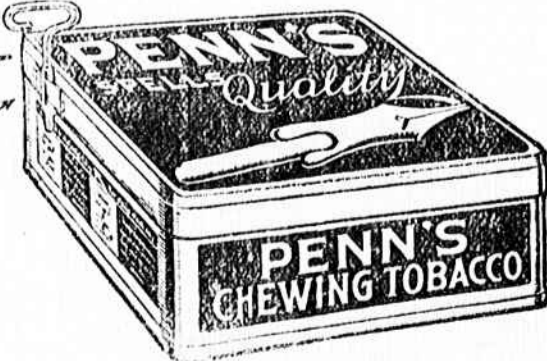
