

The General R. E. Lee MEMORIAL.

The grand monument to the memory of Gen. Lee is now being rapidly constructed under the direction and skill of Prof. Valentine. And in order to complete it at the earliest possible day, the Executive Committee of the Lee Memorial Association, of Lexington, Va., which is composed of such distinguished men as Gen'l. Pendleton, Gen'l. Terry, Hon. Wm. McLaughlin, Col. Preston Johnson, Charles Davidson and others, have authorized the publication and sale of a perfect steel engraved Portrait of Gen. Lee. The proceeds of its sale to be applied in furtherance of the object of this Association, namely: to the erection of a monument to the memory of Gen. R. E. Lee, at the Washington and Lee University, Lexington, Va. The portrait will be sold only by subscription, through regular authorized agents. Every subscriber for the portrait will receive a certificate signed by the Secretary and Chairman of the Lee Memorial Association. We commend this portrait to the public, and hope some good energetic man will secure the agency in this section in order to help on the good work. Messrs. W. W.
