Among the many evidences of the growth and properity of Charleston there is none, perhaps mes cheering or more complete than that which is afforded by the extensive factory of Mesers. Y. P. Russell & Co., at the east end of Hasel

THE MAIN PACTORY

is located in a spacious building, three-stories in height. Upon the first floor, the principal feature is an immense lathe, upon which huge sticks of timber are turned into columns and pillars. There are also other machines used in preparing material for doors, sashes and blinds. The machinery of the entire factory is driven by a powerful engine located on this floor, the boiler being in a fire-proof outhouse adjoining.

A PLANING MACHINE.

a complication of cogs and wheels, but in itself the perfection of mechanical skill and ingenuity. A rough board is run through it, and, and tongued and grooved ready for use for ceil-ing and thoring. On the second floor, where the material prepared below is glued together, there are all the latest improvements in ma-chinery. In the manufacture of blinds, for instance, no work at all is performed by hand.— The slats are cut, planed and trimmed to the proper size by machinery. The side pieces are put into a machine that grasps them and punches the holes into which the slats are fitted, and, in less time almost than it takes to tell it, the blind is ready to be glued together. In making books and window pranes, all the moulding, morticing, dove-tailing and planing is done by machinery, and there is little need for other human bely that are the read for other human bely the read for the read f

tle need for other human help than such as is necessary to direct and manipulate the machinery. The stuff is all cut out and shaped on the second floor. It is then left to dry and season for several weeks, and is finally put together and carried up to the store room on the third floor. Here the glazing and painting is done, and the here the glazing and painting is uone, and the sashes, blinds and doors of all sizes and descriptions are stored away to fill orders. But it is not alone to the making of windows and doors that the work is confined. There is now in course

A SPACIOUS CARPENTER SHOP, which will be supplied with improved machin-ery, and in which will be built all the separate parts which constitute the framework of a house. At this time the firm are taking orders for the erection of houses, every part of which is built in their establishment, and sent off in detached pieces. The facilities for doing the work are of course ample, and houses are frequently cut out, as it were, and sent off to distant parts of the State to be erected. Messrs. W. P. Russell & Co. have associated with them, as superin-tendent of their establishment, Mr. Wm. C. Speir, an active and energetic architect and mechanic, and plans and specifications of buildings can now be had at the factory.

The coonomy with which the entire establish-

ment is managed is worthy of note. The
**REFECTABLE FOR THE PREVENTING OF FIRE
are numerous. Under the main building is an
enormous cistern, and on every floor are placed
racks of buckets filled with water, which are every evening taken down and placed on the floor in different parts of the building. But the most ingenious feature of the entire economy of the establishment is in the management of the watchman system. The night watchman is armed with an instrument called Buerk's watchman's clock, which he has to carry around with him, and which is itself a triumph of mechanical art. It has six keys which are locked up in little boxes placed in different portions of the premises; and the watch is run in such a way that the watchman has to visit each are of these station boxes once every thirty minutes during the night. Should he miss a round the dial of the clock tells the tale in the morning, and the sleeper is fined. So perfect is the mechanism of this instrument that by no possibility can the watchman evade his duty without detection, and the station boxes being placed in such positions as to carry him through the entire premises once every half hour, the protection to the place period to the place period to the place period to the place. MR. W. P. RUSSEEL, is an energetic man, and has by his own individual effort built up the large factory which now bears his name. The establishment is a monument of sharp practical business talent, and a wisit to the place and an examination of its de-tails and intricacies will amply repay the visi-tor. The factory gives employment to about sixty persons who are kept busy supplying the demands of a business that is increasing daily.

THE COLORED MILITIA .- The lovers of peace and order throughout the State will regret to learn that steps are being taken in various sections to organize colored militia companies. So preposterous does the measure seem, that when first we heard such a movement was on foot, we were loth to believe it, and only credited the story as an idle sensational rumor. But our doubts, we regret to say, were unfounded, and while companies have already been organized in some localities.

We deprecate this movement, and hope our colored citizens will reflect before taking a step which cannot confer the least possible benefit upon them, either as a class or individually, while it may possibly involve them in trouble, to the detriment of both races, and cause a repetition of the troubles of only two years ago from which this immediate section has not yet recovered. Surely, neither the whites nor the blacks desire a recurrence of those troublous times. We do not speak menacingly. - Yorkville
