ORANGEBURG C. H., S. C., March 15, 1867.
In accordance with the recent Changes made in the Internal Revenue Law, all Special Taxes, (previously called Licenses) as also Incomes for 1866, Carriages, Billiard Tables, Plate, of either Gold or Silver and Watches, are to be returned immediately. Special Taxes will date from March 1st instead of May 1st, as formerly, unless returned within time specified by law a penalty of ten per centum, will be added. Persons carrying on any business for which a License or Special Tax is imposed, are liable to a fine of \$500.
I will be at my office at Orangeburg C. H., on Tuesday and Saturday of every week, and will give all desired information. Other days I will visit the different Precincts or Polls, of which due notice shall be given.

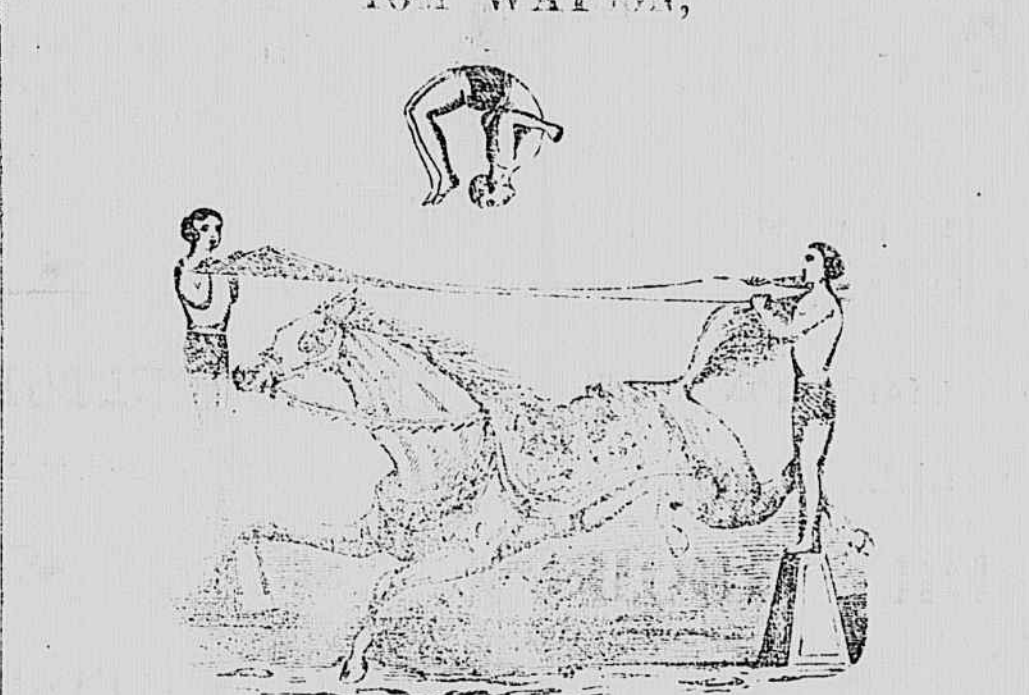

I will also attend at Orangeburg daily, during the week ending May 11, when the General Tax Books will be closed, and those failing to make returns will be Dealt Taxed.

The following is a list of Taxable Property, Returns, &c.: Lands, Lots and Buildings, Articles manufactured in this State, return to be made by manufacturer Spirituous Liquors made and sold, Huggies, Carriages, Gold and Silver Plate, Watches, Jewelry and Pinios, Professions, Employments, &c., including New papers, Insurance, Express and Telegraph Companies, Photographers, Incomes from Salaries, Rents, Interest, &c., Sales from a Grist Mill, Hoels, Restaurants, Butchers, Billiard Tables and Bar-Rooms, Ferries, Public Haeks, Drays, and Baggage Wagons, Dogs, except one for each Plantation or inhabited Lot in Town or Village, a Capitation Tax on all Males between the ages of twenty-one and fifty, and on all Sales of Goods, Wares and Merchandise made from the 1st day of January, 1866, to 1st day of January, 1867, and from 1st day of January, 1867, to 1st day of January, 1868.
Returns of Spirituous Liquors and of Goods, Wares and Merchandise sold since 1st January, 1867, will be made for the quarter ending with March and paid at the expiration of each Quarter. The final returns on the Quarterly Tax will be taken during Court Week at Orangeburg, and the Returns will be closed on the 23rd of April.
Every Employer will make Returns of the names of all P. R. on that are employed by him.
All Returns of Property will be made in person and under Oath, and paid in the District where the Property is located, and no returns will be received by mail, or otherwise, unless sworn to according to law.
Taxes will be paid only in Gold and Silver coin, United States Treasury Notes, or notes declared to be a legal tender by the Government of the United States, or notes of National Banks, or the bills receivable of this State, or pay certificates of Jurors and Constables for attendance on the Courts.
Residents of the Town of Orangeburg are required to make their Quarterly and General Returns on Wednesday and Thursday of Court Week.
