### Public Meeting.

On Monday last, the 8th instant, in pursuance of a notice announced last sale day, a number of the citizens of the District met at the Court House for the purpose of taking into consideration the peculiar condition of the people, and of adopting some measure by which to prevent the carrying on of civil suits at the ensuing Session of the Court of Common Pleas.

The meeting having been organized by the appointment of Dr. J. H. O'Cain as Chairman, and E. Ezekiel, Esq., as Secretary. A person present moved that a petition be drawn up to be forwarded to General Sickles, praying him to interpose his military power and put a stop to all civil causes. Pending its consideration, Col. Oliver moved as a substitute that a committee be appointed to confer with the Bar of the District, and request them to continue the Civil Docket; this was adopted, and Col. Oliver, Col. Rumph, and Adam Smoke, PEsq. were appointed. These, in a short time, reported that the Bar would hold a meeting at once and reply in a short time.

While awaiting their reply, Rev. I. S. K. Legare, after commenting on the extreme destitution in some portions of the District, moved that a committee be appointed to solicit contributions in aid of the indigent, who should report their success through the District papers. This was carried, and Rev. I. S. K. Legare, and Messrs. Briggman and Hamilton were named as the committee.
