### Outrageous Robbery.

On last Saturday highli aik freedmen, laborers on the plantation of Mr. Russell Zimmer man, concocted a plan for robbing the store of Mr. T. H. Rickenbaker in this District. They proceeded thither, and called up Mr. S. E. Rickenbakovas M. ATI MITH Alis won was absent. The store was formerly a gin house, and had a partition dividing off the room for storing vinegar, molasses, &c., from the rest of the store. The darkeys inquired for syrup and upon Mr. R's. going into the small room for the purpose of drawing it, they managed to steal a quantity of bacon, pairs of shoes, and other articles. Upon his return with the syrup, Mr. S. E. R. did not, owing to the dim light, observe that these articles were abstracted; and he theft was not discovered until Monday morning, when Mr. T. E. R., upon opening the store, observed it immediately. Suspicion at once settled upon those parties, and the father and son proceeded to Mr. Zimmerman's, scarched the houses of these freedmen and found many of the stolen articles, which they took from the negroes, and started on their return: but were waylaid on the road by the same freednich with some others, and again robbed of the articles they had recovered, they being married, and the freeduce attacking

Not satisfied with this, these desperadoes actually proceeded to Mr. Rickenbaker's place. and with arms in their hands, and the asser tion that there were a hundred men in the swamp, hear by at their call, they would have proceeded to further acts of lawlessness; but on this occasion, they carried matters a step too ·地區透過1四1945/45


