OBITUARY. Within the past week, this community has been called to mourn the loss of one of its best citizens, and to weep over the death of an upright, noble gentleman. On the 5th day of the present month, HENRY ELLIS passed away. In the bosom of his family, surrounded by his friends, he breathed out the last of his useful life.

As an office lawyer and counsellor, he had few equals. His "law instincts" were strong and invariably correct, and his conclusions, though seldom reached without care and haste, were seldom wrong. One of the most remarkable traits of his mind, was his wonderful memory. Every trifle of years gone by, was "raked up" there. And he often exhibited no little pride, in convincing his friends of its accuracy. It is said, he was frequently referred to for dates and facts when he was troubled to refer to the records of the office, and his recollection of these was as accurate as if he had perfect confidence, and in case of "Myers," as a witness, he testified as to the entire contents of a will, not in any verbatim, which he had "drawn years ago." In his very last moments his mind reverted to some scenes of his youth, and he told of little circumstances as they then occurred, with the minuteness of detail which belongs to things of yesterday.

Mr. Ellis' practice continued to be lucrative until a few months before his death, when his illness overtook him. He had probably always the largest collection business at this bar. In this branch he was eminently successful. This was owing, without doubt, to his great industry and his thorough knowledge of the circumstances and means of every man in the District—advantages fully appreciated by his clients. As a man, Mr. Ellis realized earnestly that the "duties of life are more than life." As a husband, his kindness, devotion and thoughtfulness never diminished. His great care seemed always to be his life's partner of even the smallest of those domestic duties which so few men regard as worthy attention. His affection for her was unbounded, and was shown in every act of his life. In his illness, none could minister to his wants save herself. She never left him for one moment that he did not kiss her, and call for her again, and as while in health, he ever considered her as his life, in his illness, she gave up everything for him, and he looked on him all the deep devotion of woman's love. The hospitality of his nature, had neither bounds nor limits. His house and table were always accessible to his acquaintances and the stranger visiting Orangeburg never failed to find in him a "friend" and in his house a "home," and his hearty, honest greeting ever made his visitor feel that he was sincere and earnest. As a father he was devoted and indulgent to a fault. We doubt if either of his children can remember hearing a harsh word from him.
