WHAT MAKES A BUSHEL .- For the benefit of those who are not thoroughly posted in such matters, we publish a statement, showing what constitutes a bushel :

Corn, shelled, fifty-six pounds. Rye, fifty-six pounds. Irish potatoes, sixty pounds. Barley, forty-six pounds. Wheat, sixty pounds. Corn, on the cob, seventy pounds. Buckwheat, fifty-two pounds. Dats, thirty-two pounds. Sweet potatoes, fifty pounds. Onions, fifty-seven pounds. Beans, sixty-two pounds. Bran, twenty pounds. Clover seed, forty-five pounds. Timothy seed, sixty pounds, Flax seed, fifty-six pounds. Hemp seed, forty-five pounds. Blue grass, fourteen pounds. Dried apples, twenty-four pounds. Dried peaches, thirty-three pounds of peeled and thirty-six of unpecled.
