


The Peanut

The Peanut crop offers wonderfu opportunities. It can be grown over the entire South with profit. It reaches its perfection in growth and yield on well drained, gray, sandy loam soils such as exist in the Coastal Plains along the Atlantic Scaboard, which territory is now either occupied or is being rapidly encroached upon by the Boll Weevil.

There is a constant demand at a "Cash Surrender Value"- from a market that would be difficult to glut with the peanut, for the reason that there are five avenues of profit.


