THE CORN CROP IN VIRGINIA .- The Richmond Republic, of a recent issue, in reference to this subject, has the following:

While the area planted in corn in Eastern Virginia is probably not one-fourth as great as that of 1860, the quality of the present crop has never been exceeded. It is not believed that ever before was there, on the same number of stalks, so large a quantity of grain. This is the concurrent testimony of persons who have recently passed through most of our eastern and northern counties. As the people have nothing but their crops to which to look for support during the current year, the prospect of abundance is, even more than in ordinary times, a subject of congratulation.

In the country along the Upper James, about In the country along the Upper James, about Lynchburg, and in the southwestern part of the State generally, a splendid corn-growing region, it may be remarked, we fear there has been already too much rain, while, from present indications, the prospect is that there is to be much more. An excess of rain produces an immense crop of stalk, but little corn. The rains that have fallen during the past two weeks prevailed in the country just mentioned, have been very heavy, and have done incalculable damage to the crops and in various other ways.

To Civil. Officers.—An important point, says the Macon Telegraph, in the last proclamation of President Johnson, is that relating to the civil officers of the State. By referring to the document it will be seen that he "declares that all civil officers who have taken and subscribed the oath prescribed in the proclamation aforesaid, if not embraced within any of the exceptions, or who may have received special amosty if embraced, shall proceed thereafter in the discharge of the duties of their several offices according to the laws in existence prior to the 1st of January, 1861," so far as the same are not inconsistent with our present condition. ent condition.
