RENTS .- The rents of houses and stores have gone up to a very high figure in the city, and many in business are discussing within themselves whether their profits will be sufficient to meet the heavy demands of landlerds. Some out of business, but propared to go into it lightly, being backed with limited funds, are checked in the out start by the exorbitant amounts asked for stores. The establishments also, best suited for trade, or, as it is termed, the best "stands," are already leased, and the large sums now demanded are for comparatively ill-suited buildings, not in the heart of trade, and with few or no conveniences.

-0--ARRIVAL OF THE QUAKER CITY. - This superior steamship, under the command of Captain WEST, reached her wharf about seven o'clock last evening. She left New York on Saturday afternoon, but, owing to a difficulty with the machinery, she was detained below that city until Sunday forenoon. She brings a heavy freight, and about sixty cabin passengers-among others we noticed our popular citizen, Dr. KENIFICK, Captain THOMAS LOCKWOOD, Capt. S. ADKINS, Messrs. E. R. Cow-PERTHWAIT, W. T. BURGE, F. A. SAWYER, F. RICH-ARDS, and T. W. BLISS.

ARRIVAL OF STEAMSHIP GENERAL SHERMAN .-This vessel reached her wharf in this city about mid-day yesterday, having left New York on Saturday afternoon last. We are indebted to Capt. PENDLETON for favors. The steamship Quaker City was advertised to leave New York at 6 P. M. on Saturday last for this port.

BILL OF MORTALITY.-The report of the City Registrar for the last week gives as the total number of deaths forty-five, of which twonty-five were children, and thirteen adult blacks and coloredleaving but six white adults. Of fevers, there were six deaths of whites-three grown and three children, and of dropsy, four blacks. The mor-tality among children appears greater than it has been for some weeks, probably the result of the extreme hot weather from which we have been suffering for some time back. On the whole, however, the city continues remarkably healthy, and we trust will continue so until the winter sets in, which is near at hand, and when all fears of being visited by diseases of a malignant type must vanish.


