WILMINGTON, September 25.—Business, as is to be expected, has been unusually dull today. There is nothing coming down the river at or will there until they rise. Produce is accumulating in large quantities at all points, and when brought in, lively times may be expected along the wharves for awhile. This is the first instance we think since the introduction of light draught steamers on our rivers that navigation has been so long interrupted.

NAVAL STORES—We note the sale of a small lot of crude turpentine at \$3.50, and tar \$5.50. No transactions in spirits or rosin.

Timber—One raft very inferior Poplar sold at \$12 per M. feet.

CORN—About 600 bushels received per railroad were sold today at \$1.12½; the latter price for a small quantity.

AUGUSTA, Sept. 23.—Since my last respects we have noticed a quiet market generally.  
Cotton—Has been brisk, and is now held firm, in anticipation of lower rates of freight per river. Middling 32; strict do. 34; sales 323 bales Virginia, 323; 32; Cotton (Georgia)—Are off from the coast about 4. 4-B. Sheet, 36; 3/4 Shirtings 21c., for Augusta's; Montour's 1c. less, with quiet market. Yarns \$2.75, taxes unpaid.

Small quantities of new Corn are placed at \$1.10 and \$1.12½.

Market quiet at \$3c. for 35c. Lard is quite scarce, with a good demand at 35c. Family parcels 35c.

BOSTON, September 23.—The Commercial Bulletin reports the sales of wool as very heavy. The sales of one house alone for the week foot up some 600,000 lbs.; of another, 650,000 lbs.; of another, 400,000 lbs.; of another, 478,000 lbs.; and several others upward of 2,000,000 lbs. all domestic staple, and almost the entire amount taken for actual consumption.


