FELLOW-CITIZENS: As I learn that many of you contemplate voting for me as your next Representative in the United States Congress, I think it right that I should briefly express to you my views and sentiments respecting the present condition and policy of our section.

My private interests greatly demand my presence at home, and my personal inclinations would induce me to remain here for all time to come; but I feel under many obligations to disregard those influences, and for a time longer to remain in the public service.

From what I have said, you will readily understand that I think the true policy of the South, for the future, is precisely the reverse of all that, heretofore, constituted the sum of Southern political principles and Southern policy.

Our condition being entirely reversed, our policy must be reversed also. The North has consolidated the United States Government to an extent that secures our subjugation. It is possible within our power to consolidate it still further, and to an extent that shall, ere long, enable a wise and vigorous Executive to rule over all sections of the Union with impartiality and even-handed justice.
