THE COMPROMISE OF THE CURRENCY HAS PROPOSED THE FOLLOWING RULES FOR THE REDEMPTION OF NATIONAL BANK NOTES. First—The notes are to be redeemed by the banks by which they are respectively issued, and should not be returned to the office in sums less than five hundred dollars or over multiples of that amount.
