Stock on hand. RICE.—There has been no receipts during the week, and we have heard of no transactions. We continue our quotations as before—say 11½c to 12½c. per lb. for clean Carolina.

NAVAL STORES.—Some eight hundred bbls. of Roasin has reached here since our last, and we are informed that sales of low No. 1, has taken place at \$13 per bbl., No. 2 at \$9, and No. 3 at \$6 per bbl.

HAY.—Some nine hundred bales of Eastern has reached this market since last week, and has been sold at a price in the vicinity of \$1.80 per hundred. We quote the article in limited parcels at \$1.75 to \$2 for North River, and \$2 to \$2.25 for Eastern.

CORN.—Two thousand seven hundred bushels of White Maryland has come to hand, and was disposed of yesterday at \$1.21 per bushel.

OATS.—There has been no arrivals during the week, and we have heard of no large sales, but the grain may be quoted at 65c. per bushel.

SALT.—There has been no addition to the stock of this article in the last week, and sales of large lots are taking place from on shipboard at \$3 per sack.

FREIGHTS to Liverpool are dull, with a strong disposition to a decline. It was rumored yesterday that \$4. had been accepted, but up to a late hour the report was unfounded, so far as we could learn.

WILMINGTON, December 6—6 P. M.—There has been a fair amount of business doing to-day.

Wheat.—We report the sale of 1000 bushels of No. 1 hard, \$1.12 for medium, and \$1.10 for soft; 2000 bushels of No. 2 hard, \$1.05 for medium, and \$1.00 for soft.
