

THE ILL-FATED ATLANTIC.

FURTHER DETAILS OF THE APPALLING CATASTROPHE.

The List of Saved and Missing—Excuses of the Captain and the Liverpool Agents—Walls of the Widowed and Fatherless.

The agents of the White Star Line have ordered one hundred coffins for the bodies that have already floated ashore from the Atlantic wreck.

The captain of the Atlantic attributes the disaster to the speed of the vessel, which must have made more than nine knots an hour to get so far out of her course.

The latest accounts report four hundred and thirteen saved and five hundred and sixty lost, including three hundred and fifty women and children.
