MEXICO AND THE UNITED STATES Maximilian to Recognize the Confederacy!

Augurt, April 14. - Havana dates of March 22 say Maximilian will immediately recognize the Southern Confederacy, and open to them the port of Tampieo, or seme other in which to carry prizes for adjudication and sale. The non-recognition by the Washington Administration of the Mexican Empire will be productive of unpleasant feelings on the part of Maximilian to the United States.

European dates of March 19 announce the failure of several targe blockade running firms. Drafts for large amounts having been made by the Confederate Government on their financial agents in Liverpool, Frazer, Trenholm & Co., were afterthree days' delay, refused acceptance and protested; one of the drafts was for \$185,is asserted that the drafts will not lie over beyoud a few days.

Foreign emigration to the United States opens briskly. The early arrivals from Ireland indicate a large movement through the present season. The steamships Virginia and City of Manchester arrived in New York on the 29th March,
