#### By Telegraph. From Mississippi.

CINCINNATI, September 7.-The Commercial, of to-day, has a despatch dated Jackson, Miss., September 4, saying Gen. Slocam has issued an order by direction of the President, enjoining upon his officers not to interfere with the organization of the State militia ordered by Provisional Governor Sharkey.

Gen. Slocum's order is considered to be of great importance, as fixing definitely the policy of reconstruction to be followed in Mississippi.

#### Interesting from Mexico.

NEW YORK, September 8.-The steamship Manhattan, from Vera Cruz on the 23d ult., via Havana on the 2d inst., brought despatches containing news from Mexico of interest. Affairs in that country continue in a very confused condition, and it appears almost impossible to arrive at the real status of matters. The Republicans had been driven out of the town of had been driven out of the town of Tehuacan, and the Imperialists were unsophisticatedly chuckling over the supposed material reduction of Gen. Sheridan's military force in Texas. The guerillas still give illimitable trouble to Maximilian's troops, and there is apparently no improvement in the social or moral condition of the country. country.

#### Aid Wanted for Mayti.

NEW YORK, September 8.—The Haytien war stamer Geffrard, Captain Ravigneau, from Hayti on the 22d ult., via Beaufort, N. C., on the 2d inst., arrived at this port last evening.

Captain Ravigneau, who, with the exception of the chief engineer is the only white man on board the steamer, is the bearer of despatches to President Johnson from Nicholas Fabre Geffrard, the beleaguered President of that unfortunate republic.

Captain Ravigneau's mission to Washington is understood to be to ask the United States Government for assistance in quelling the revolt which, under the leadership of Salnave, has assumed such formidable proportions in Hayti. He will leave for Washington with-out delay with his despatches.

The Great Overland Telegraph Expedition.

STIKA, August 21, VIA NEW WEST-MINSTER, September 7, 1865.—The bark Clara Bell will sail from here to-

morrow for New Westminster. The schooner Milton Badger will also sail for Anadyr Bay to-morrow, with an exploring party on board and full supplies of equipments. This party will be the advance explorers of the route from the Anadyr River to the Amoor. The bark Golden Gate will also sail

for Fort St. Michael's and the Youkon River, with the steamer Lizzie Horner on board. The parties who will explore the Youkon River are also on board the Golden Gate.

The steamer Wright will also sail for the mouth of the Youkon River and the Gulf of Anadyr. Colonel Charles S. Bulkley, Engineer-in-Chief of the Overland Telegraph Expedi-tion, goes on the latter; and after di-recting the preliminary operations of recting the preliminary operations of the explorers of the Youkon, will proceed to Anadyr and Behring Strait.


Everything pertaining to the great expedition is progressing favorably, and the Russian officials at Sitka have extended every aid in their power. The health of the expeditionary corps is excellent.






