An Interesting Case. - A very inter-AN Interesting Case.—A very interesting case, in which the bonds of the Southern Confederacy figured, was yesterday before Judge Ingraham, of the Superior Court, at chambers. When the war broke out, George W. Gooch, the defendant in the case, according to the statements made, was in Targes as agent of the large Proceeding. in Texas as agent of the large Broadway dry goods house of Lanes, Boyce & Co., entrusted with the collection of \$175,000, due them from Texas merchants. On the 4th of March, 1861, Messrs Lanes, Boyce & Co. turned over their business to Leroy M. Wiley and Frederick N. Lawrence, who are the plaintiffs in the present action. Gooch went on with his collections and as he allegges with the action. Gooch went on with his col-lections, and, as he alleges, with the approval of Mr. Wiley, invested about \$100,000 of the money he collected in Confederate securities which, of course, have since proved worthless. A short time since, Mr. Gooch re-turned to this city, and, at the in-stance of the plaintiffs, was arrested and locked up, in default of \$25,000 stance of the plaintiffs, was arrested and locked up, in default of \$25,000 bail, on charge of misappropriation of the funds of the firm. The proceed-ings, yesterday, were in connection with a motion for his release, and there was considerable argument of counsel over the question whether the Confederate bonds turned over to the credit of his employers by Mr. Gooch credit of his employers by Mr. Gooch discharged his indebtedness to them. The decision is reserved.

A correspondent writes to the New York News from Lexington, Virginia: "The Rev. Dr. Pendleton (Brigadier-General in the Confederate army, and General Lee's Chief of Artillery,) returned after the surrender to the pas-torate of the Episcopal Church here, but after a few sermons his church was closed, and he arrested for alleged disloyal utterances. He was soon released, but has not yet been permitted to resume the duties of his pastorate.
