A colored delegate in the South Carolina Convention, says the New York Times, has offered a resolution declaring that Congress has not passed any confiscation bill, and probably never will, and the only way to procure land is to buy and pay for it. That is sensible and creditable. The fact that it was left for a colored delegate to propose such a declaration, and that one was found able and willing to do it, shows that all the dangers to the governments of the Southern States are not likely to come from the colored portion of their population.

END OF THE YUCATAN REBELLION.—Cuba cable telegrams convey the intelligence that the rebellion in Yucatan, gotten up under the auspices of Santa Anna, had been broken by the national forces under General Alatorre. The rebel forces attempted to resist his advance on Merida, at a place called Maxcanu, but were defeated, their leader killed, and the rebel Governor forced to hastily quit the capital.

A good suggestion is that of the Southern Cultivator, that our farmers should plant a portion of their fields with early Northern corn. Ripening two or three months before Southern varieties in present field use, it would enable us to have food for man and beast so much sooner.
