END OF THE YUCATAN REBELLION. Cuba cable telegrams convey the in-telligence that the rebellion in Yucatan, gotten up under the aus-pices of Santa Anna, had been broken by the national forces under General Alatorre. The rebel forces attempted to resist his advance on Merida, at a place called Maxcanu, but were defeated, their leader killed, and the rebel Governor forced to hastily quit the capital.

A good suggestion is that of the Southern Cultivator, that our farmers should plant a portion of their fields with early Northern corn. Ripening two or three months before South-ern varieties in present field use, it would enable us to have food for man and beast so much sooner.


