The official result of the late election in the State of New York for Governor is as follows: Hoffman, Democrat, 400,701; Woodford, Republican, 365,682—Democratic majority 35,069; an increase of 7,123 over the previous election. The aggregate vote of both parties, however, show a large decrease.
