

**DEATH OF MEYERBEER, THE COMPOSER.**—Late European papers announce the death of M. Meyerbeer, the author of "Robert le Diable," "Les Huguenots," "Le Prophete," and other operas, known throughout the whole world of music. This illustrious master was born at Berlin in 1794; he showed early talents for music, and was a fellow pupil of Weber, under the Abbe Vogler, at Darmstadt, at the age of 15. In his style he has carried the power of sound, *per se*, to its highest allowable pitch, and has thus paved the way for the modern German school of music. While at times he terrifies his audience with the amazing breadth and volume of sound in which he exults, he can also charm them to tears by the delicate manipulation of his subject and the exquisite pathos of his melody. He lived and died in the Jewish faith, like Halevy, his brother and competitor, whom he has followed so closely to the grave.
