11. The Confederate authorities have made a requisition upon the State for Two Thousand laborers monthly. The proportion of one-fourth heretofore called for, had failed to supply half of this number. In view of this fact and the great urgency of the demand for labor at this time, it is deemed expedient to shorten the interval between the calls, and increase the quota. This is no violation of the law, for it does not fix the quota of labor, nor the interval between the calls, but prescribes that such proportion shall be called for as will fill the requisition, giving thirty days notice. Each Division in the order fixed will be required to furnish this quota, and no injustice will be done to any.
