

DENERAL ORDERS NO. 19.

PARAGRAPH I OF GENERAL ORDERS NO. PARAGRAPH I OF GENERAL ORDERS NO 18, current series, from this office, requiring the companies organized for service beyond their Districts and persons liable to said service out not enrolled in and persons inducto said service one not encour-termanded, and they will proceed to Hamburg, S. C., and roport to Lieut. Col. W. G. DeSaussure, A. D. C., as heretofore directed.

. II. Paragraph I of General Orders No. 16, current series, from this office, requiring all persons claiming exemption from militia service on the ground of phy-sical disability, to appear before the Examining Board at Columbia or the Surgeon-General at Hamburg, S. C., is so far modified that persons who have been re-cently examined by the Boards of Confederate Surgeons and exempted from Confederate service on the ground of permanent disability, will not be required to appear before the Board at Columbia or the Surgeon-General, but will transmit copies of their certificates, through the commanding officers of companies formed in their regiments, to the Surgeon-General of the State—and in regiments where no companies have been organized, directly to the Surgeon-General-the copies of said certificate to be certified by a magistrate or a magistrate ex offici).


