2. If subscribers order the discontinuauce of their If subscribers order the discontinuated of their newspapers, the publisher may continue to send them, until all arrearages are paid.
If subscribers neglect or rofuse to take their newspapers from the offices to which they are directed, they papers from the offices to which they are directed, they have settled to be billed.

are held responsible until they have settled the bills and ordered them discontinued.
