Culture and Use of the Turnip.
The common flat English turnip was introduced into this country with English ancestry and has ever since been an object of cultivation.

A good soil for it is a fertile sand or well drained loam. Any soil adapted to Indian corn will produce good turnips. But it only on new land or freshly turned sod, that they are most successful.

CULTIVATION.—Turnips may be sown at any time from the 16th of June to the 1st of August. The first will give a greater yield; the last generally a sounder root and capable of longer preservation.
