

LOCAL ITEMS.

Beaufort, S. C., December, 9, 1875.

Christmas day comes on Saturday this year. Last week was wet miserable weather and colds were quite prevalent.

Hons. S. J. Rampfield and T. E. Miller, have been admitted to practice in the Supreme Court.

On Sunday last at the residence of the bride's parents, Mr. Edward Judd and Miss E. Hunn were married, according to the rites of the Society of Friends.

Alfred Linyard was also bound over for trial this week for burglary in breaking into the cotton house of Agrippa Polite on St. Helena Island, and stealing therefrom a quantity of cotton seed.

A vessel is on the way to lead with the phosphate that has lain on Bennett's dock Beaufort for the last two years, the property of the River Mining and Manufacturing Co.

Last week the schooner of Messrs. Waterhouse and Ricker, sprung a leak and was beached on Parry Island. Her load of cotton was greatly damaged, and after beaching several planks were forced out of place. W. H. Devlin has her in hand repairing her.

The News and Courier was in error in stating that Senator Green of this county introduced the resolution to subscribe to the STANDARD AND COMMERCIAL for the use of the Senate. This resolution was made by Senator W. H. Jones, of Georgetown, and both of them voted against free newspapers.

On Saturday last, Cuffy Smith from the rural districts, came into town for the alleged purpose of disposing of the neat little sum of \$300, but before making his purchase he thought it incumbent on him to dupe freely in "the counters," and became very noisy. The town police took him in charge, but allowed him to walk alone, and he made a break down one of the side streets, but was recaptured. The police officer in recapturing placed his finger in the prisoner's mouth, probably to ascertain his age, when the prisoner obligingly took a piece of the finger in out of the cold, or rather took it off.
