

LOCAL ITEMS.

Beaufort, S.C., December 16, 1875.

The Governor has notified the trial justices on the coast that they must not interfere between masters and seamen of foreign vessels, except in cases where actual violence is charged. All questions of dispute about wages, come under the jurisdiction of the consul of the country to which the vessel may belong.

Friday night last witnessed the funeral of the Beaufort Reading Room Association. The ceremonies were of an imposing character, the benediction being expressed by "once, twice, third and last time, and sold," as the books, tables, chairs and pictures were knocked down to the highest bidder by Mr. Jas. M. Croft, the auctioneer. The proceeds of the sale amounted to \$90. This institution has had a languishing existence for some time, and was somewhat in debt which the amount realized will cover. The executive committee complain that a large quantity of the books that were purchased by the "Memphis relief fund" have either not been returned by the members or have been stolen by other parties. One feature of this institution was a cabinet of phosphate specimens, and a contribution box, both of which have been broken open. A large quantity of valuable phosphate specimens have been removed. There are those who say that there was something in the contribution box, but that would be rather rough on the people of Beaufort, and so in charity we would rather believe that nothing had ever been contributed.
