

LOCAL ITEMS.

Beaufort, S. C., December 30, 1875.

Congressman Smalls arrived in Beaufort on Thursday last from Washington. He is looking well, his honors evidently agreeing with him.

The office of the County Treasurer will be opened about the sixth of January for the collection of taxes.

The weather at Christmas was like summer in this section, mild and warm, almost oppressively so.

The Atty. Gen. will please accept our thanks for a copy of his annual report to the General Assembly.

Lieut. Gov. Gleaves, is in town, also our members of the legislature spending their holidays after the exciting session.

The sales of plantations on the several islands will be made on separate days of which the public will be informed by hand bill.

A billiard saloon has been established in the Club House Beaufort, where knights of the cue can enjoy themselves to their heart's content.

Lovers of the weed will be pleased to learn that the revenue on tobacco will probably be reduced. It will have no effect however on those who borrow their tobacco.

On Friday last James Jackson, near Greys Hill lost his corn house and another out building by fire. Supposed to be incendiary.

On Christmas eve, a street fight occurred on Bay St. Beaufort, in which Brister Jackson was cut in several places by Ben Holmes who has been bound over by Trial Justice Carleton, for trial in February next.

For the past seven weeks the Rev. A. Wardell has been holding protracted meetings in the First A. B. Church, Beaufort. The converts will be baptised on Sunday.

The department of the direct land sales has been authorized to sell the farm lands in any desired quantity from ten acres upwards. The land on Hilton Head have never been surveyed into ten acre lots and will be sold by plantations.

As showing the faith that is reposed in the future of this section of the State, it is noticeable that an undivided thirteen fortieth of Spring Island has been sold for \$22,500. The entire island contains about five thousand acres.

The supreme court has dismissed the appeal in the case of Robert Smalls, vs. F. E. Wilder, Associate Justice Willard gave the opinion. This settles the suit in which the property on Magnolia St. was involved.

There are to be sold this week six contiguous blocks near the Court House that would make a fine race track. It would be a stroke of good policy for those possessing fine horses and others interested in such matters to combine and make the purchase. This would be another attraction for tourists to make Beaufort a winter resort.

The tax bills signed by the governor, or, levy eleven mills for State purposes, and in this county four mills for county purposes, making a total tax, with the two mills for past indebtedness, of seventeen mills, in addition to local school taxes which range from half a mill to three mills in this county.

Dr. Paul Pritchard, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners arrived in Beaufort on Monday, to hold a special meeting so as to give the necessary warrant to the county auditor, so that he can proceed with his books necessary for the collection of taxes.

Christmas day along the line of the Port Royal Railroad was spent very quietly. At several of the most important lumber stations, such is the pressure of business, large gangs of men were busily at work loading cars. At Brunson it was as quiet as Sunday. The election of Judges has not had a depressing effect as it is pretty generally expressed that people are satisfied that their property and rights are not jeopardized thereby.

Johnston of Charlotte, formerly president of the C. C. and A. R. R. Mr. Wesley and Mr. Williams of New York, Mr. McKay, who is interested in Spring Island, and Mr. Davidson of the Augusta Constitutional. They were much pleased with Port Royal and the advantages it possesses.
