**FEMALE INTREPIDITY.**

Six—The following instance of female heroism which occurred in December last, is worthy of record, and as it happened in a country where the press is enslaved, I am of opinion it will be buried in oblivion if not rescued by you. In spite of all the threats and tortures which were inflicted on her to make her reveal the authors of these documents found in her possession, she persisted in secrecy to the last, and this heroic woman died with the greatest fortitude, exclaiming to the moment of her execution, "You shall not hear it from my mouth; I will die—and may those live who can free the country."
