An Ordinance.

By order and under an Ordinance of the Town Council of Camden, passed and ratified on the 24th day of January, A. D. 1818, entitled "An Ordinance to regulate the granting of Licenses for Keeping Taverns, and Retail shops and Liquor Stores in the Town of Camden."

IT is hereby Ordained by the authority of the Mayor and Wardens of the Town of Camden.

1st. That all Licenses heretofore granted under this or any other Ordinance, shall expire on the first Monday in June following next, after the date of the said License, so that all Licenses shall expire annually on that day. And if any License is granted, shall be of a date later than the first Monday in June, a proportionate sum shall be deducted from the amount demanded for the use of the said Town, for the said License, for the number of weeks which shall be wanting to complete one year in the time granted to sell or retail by the said License.

2d. That from and after the first Monday in June next, any person or persons wishing to obtain a License for Keeping Tavern, or Retail Shop, or Liquor Store, in the Town of Camden, shall apply by petition to the Town Council, for the same, in which shall be set forth the nature of the License applied for, and the names of two or more persons, who are willing to become security in the bond to be given by the person applying, when such License is granted.

3d. That if upon the hearing of such petition, a majority of the Town Council shall be of opinion that the said License should be granted, an entry shall be made in the Minutes or Journals of the Council to that effect, and the Recorder shall thereupon cause the person petitioning to be notified of the same, and require he, she or them to appear in a day named, with the securities before the Town Council, to sign and execute the bond above referred to, and upon the same being executed and the money demanded for the said License paid, the Recorder shall issue the License applied for.

4th. That before a License to keep a Tavern, or Retail Shop or Liquor Store shall be issued, the person or persons applying therefor shall pay to the Treasurer of the Town, the sum of nine dollars, and the sum of one dollar to the Recorder, for the License numbered One in the Ordinance above referred to.—The sum of one dollar to the Treasurer, for the use of the Town, and one dollar to the Recorder, for the License numbered Two in the said Ordinance.—And the sum of forty eight dollars to the Treasurer, for the use of the Town, and two dollars to the Recorder, for the License numbered Three in the said Ordinance.

5th. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances, which are repugnant to the spirit and meaning of this Ordinance, be and they are hereby repealed.
