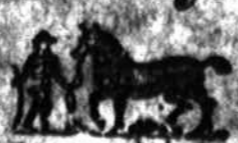

Town Taxes.

All persons interested are requested to take notice of the following clauses of Ordinances, of the Town Council of Camden, respecting Town Taxes.

Camden June 25, 1818.
Extract from an Ordinance passed 26th May 1817.

AN ORDINANCE

For raising and paying into the Town Treasury, the sums therein mentioned, for the use and benefit of the Town of Camden.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Intendant and Wardens of the town of Camden, in Council Assembled, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, that all persons residing within said Town, raising and suffering to run at large therein, Hogs of any description, shall pay a fine of one dollar on each Hog; and if any person shall refuse to comply with this Ordinance, all such Hogs, or a part, as the case may be, belonging to such person or persons so refusing, shall be seized and sold for the purpose of paying the above fine, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid to the person or persons whose Hogs have been so seized and sold.

Extract from an Ordinance passed July 7th, 1817.

And be it further Ordained, by the authority aforesaid that one third of the amount of the general tax upon all Negroes, and Landed Property within the Town of Camden be imposed upon all persons holding such property within the limits of said Town.

And be it further Ordained, by the authority aforesaid, that all persons owning the above kinds of property within the limits of said Town of Camden be required to make a return of the same to the Town Recorder, on or before the 15th of July, 1817, to whom those taxes shall be paid on or before the 1st day of August next, and annually afterwards.
