AN ACT To Provide for the Calling of a Convention of the People of this State.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, now met and sitting in General Assembly, and by the authority of the same, That a Convention of the People of this State, to be held in the City of Columbia, on Monday, the twentieth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, for the purpose of taking into consideration the expediency of amending the Constitution of this State, shall be called to meet at the City of Columbia, on the said day, at ten o'clock in the forenoon.

Sec. 2. That on the sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, the Managers of Elections for the several Districts in the State, shall give public notice as in cases of elections for members of the Legislature, upon the polls and hold elections in their respective Districts for the purpose of electing a Convention, in the same manner and form, and the same places, as elections are now conducted for members of the Legislature. And all persons who are qualified and entitled, by the Constitution and laws of this State, to vote at the polls, shall be qualified and entitled to vote for said Delegates to said Convention; and in case of any vacancy occurring, by death, resignation or removal from the State, or refusal to accept of any person elected a Delegate to the said Convention, the presiding officer of the said Convention shall issue his writ authorizing and requiring the Managers of Elections in the Election District in which such vacancy may have occurred, to hold an election to fill such vacancy, as in cases for the election of the Legislature; that the Managers in the said Election Districts and Jurors, shall meet on Friday, the first day of December, next, to open a poll and hold an election to fill such vacancy; that the Managers in the said Election Districts, shall be qualified and entitled to vote for members of the said Convention, and the calling of the said Convention shall be held in the Senate House, on the twelfth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the eighty-fifth year of the sovereignty and independence of the United States of America.

Sec. 3. That each Election District through out the State shall be entitled to elect and send to the said Convention a number of Delegates equal to the whole number of Senators and Representatives which such District is now entitled to send to the Legislature; and the Delegates to the said Convention shall be entitled to the same freedom of arrest in going to, returning from, and whilst in attendance at, said Convention, as is extended to the members of the Legislature.

Sec. 4. That all free white male citizens of this State, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, and who are entitled to vote for members of the State Legislature, shall be eligible to act in the said Convention. In the Senate House, on the twelfth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the eighty-fifth year of the sovereignty and independence of the United States of America.

Sec. 5. That the Clerks of the Senate and House of Representatives, and are hereby instructed to publish the Act to provide for the calling of a Convention of the People of this State, in one newspaper in each Election District in the State, once a week, until the day of election of the Delegates to said Convention; and that it is the sense of this General Assembly that the Managers of Elections are bound to proceed to give the usual notice of election, and to hold the same, as directed by said Act, without awaiting further instructions.

Sec. 6. That the Clerks of the Senate and House of Representatives, and are hereby instructed to publish the Act to provide for the calling of a Convention of the People of this State, in one newspaper in each Election District in the State, once a week, until the day of election of the Delegates to said Convention; and that it is the sense of this General Assembly that the Managers of Elections are bound to proceed to give the usual notice of election, and to hold the same, as directed by said Act, without awaiting further instructions.
