Be it Ordained by the Town Council of Abbrille, That, on and after the fourth Sunday of July inst., all negroes living beyond the Corporate limits will be strictly prohibited from coming into the Village to Church, except, with special permission from their masters; nor will they be allowed to congregate on the Streets, before or after preaching nor will they be allowed to coin into the village at wight around with special nermission and then will they be allowed to come into the village at-night except with special permission and then to leave the place immediately upon the accom-plishment of their errands. Nor, will they be allowed to come to the Village Churches at night at all. Sec. 2. In each and every instance, in which

Sec. 2. In each and every instance, in which this Ordinance shall be violated, the negroes so offending, shall be taken to the public Jail, and there confined until taken out by their masters on payment of the sum of one dollar per capita besides the jail fees.


