[PUBLIC, No. -23.] AN ACT to give effect to patents for pub- volunteers who may be received into the ed persons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of .imerica in Congress assembled, That in all cases where patents for publie lands have been or may hereafter be is- United States. sued, in pursuance of any law of the United States, to a person who had died, or who shall bereafter die, before the date of such patent, the title to the land designated therein shall coure to, and become vested in, the heirs, devisers, or assigne s, of such deceased patentee, as if the patent had issued to the deceased person during life; and the provisions of this act shall be construed to extend to patents for lands within the Virginia Military D strict in the State of Onio.
