LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES PASSED AT THE SECOND SESSION OF THE TWENTY-FOURTH CONGRESS

[Public- No. 1] AN ACT to regulate, in certain cases, the disposition of the proceeds of lands ceded by Indian tribes of the United States. Be it enacted, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled...
