

Some time since we published a request to our planting friends, to give us some idea of the yield per acre, of the crop, and cotton crops of their section, as compared with last year. We regret to say that few only have done us, not enough to enable us to approximate the general result. At the meeting of the Agricultural Association, held on the 14th of last month, forty different reports were received from various sections, averaging a loss of one-third of both cotton and corn crops, but an increase of one hundred per cent in the oat crop. We are very much inclined to believe that the farmers were too desponding, and rated their crops at less than they will finally turn out, at any rate we hope so. If planters will only take the little trouble of informing us of the quantity of cotton and corn they expect to make per acre this year, and how much made last year, we can get a general average of how far short the crop will fall, that we think would be of great interest to the planter; the reports now, we rather think, would show a better state of things than they did a month ago. Let us hear from you gentlemen.

To our knowledge, six have died within the past two weeks. On Tuesday morning last a little colored girl, living on the suburbs of Aiken, was very severely bitten by a rattlesnake. Dr. Croft was called in immediately, and to his skillful exertions the parents owe the life of the child. There is a movement on foot to establish a shoe factory at Hodes, Abbeville county. Twenty-three hundred dollars have been subscribed in the neighborhood, and sixteen hundred dollars in another community near by. Four thousand dollars in machinery and equipments have been promised by parties from Lynn, Massachusetts.
