## OUR GOVERNMENT. HOW IT MAY BE IMPROVED AND PERPETUATED.

Some Thoughts in Connection With the Address of the Democratic State Executive Committee, Presented by a Former Son of Palmetto.

Gen. A. J. Brantley, Chairman State Democratic Executive Committee.

DEAR SIR: Your address to the people of South Carolina has arrested my attention. Though not in political life, yet my educational work does not prevent me from observing closely and attentively what is transpiring in the politics of the country. Allow me to congratulate your Committee upon striking the key-note of the campaign, not striking the issues between the two great parties that divide the country. Constitutional Government or Centralized Despotism is the true issue of the present Presidential campaign. It is thought that the triumph of the Democratic party would cure the evil that threatens the dissolution of our form of Government. I must respectfully dissent from such a view. The triumph of the Democracy would doubtless palliate the evil, and would promote largely the good of the land; but something more than a mere party triumph is necessary. The reflection is not to be thought of to offer, with due respect to the State and the country at large, will appear in the condensed view that I here give of our Government as it was and as it is, and in the suggestions of a Convention of the States to provide new guards for our political security. I do not decline myself with the view that my views are likely to attract much attention, but in giving them expression, I shall at least enjoy the consciousness of having discharged a duty, not the less obligatory because self-imposed.

It may be affirmed that the Government of this country, as originally established, is the grandest political achievement whereof History gives any record—illustrating above all others more skill, more wisdom and a higher standard. In his profound work on the history of European Civilization, M. Guizot, with exacting truth, remarks: "Of all the systems of government and political guarantee, it may be asserted without fear of contradiction that the most difficult to establish and render effectual is the federative system; a system which consists in leaving to each place or province, (State?) and each society, all that portion of government which can abide there, and in taking from it only so much of it as is indispensable to a general society, in order to carry it to the centre of this larger society and to embody it under the form of a central authority. This federative system, theoretically the most simple, is found in practice the most complex; for in order to reconcile the degree of independence, of local liberty, which is permitted to remain, with the degree of general order, of general supervision, which in certain cases it supposes and exacts, evidently requires a very advanced state of civilization—requires, indeed, that the will of man, that individual liberty, should concur in the establishment and maintenance of the system much more than in any other, because it possesses less than any other the means of coercion."

"The federative system, then, is one which evidently requires the greatest maturity of reason, of morality, of civilization in the society to which it is applied. This kind of government, if difficult to construct, is still more difficult to maintain. The statesmen of our revolutionary era tried it and succeeded. What the barons of Europe failed to effect, the barons of America succeeded in consummating. And this is the great glory of the constitution-makers of 1787."

The Constitutional Government of these States composing the American Union was peculiar in its origin. Other constitutions—and this gives to them large advantages—have been the product of favorable circumstances—the result of long-existing and long-operating experiments. Such constitutions grow out of the political life of the skin; they grow out of the tissues of the body that it enfolds; and they are thus not fit to closely and well, neither too loose nor too tight, but to adapt themselves to the form and contour of the country and the people of the country. Hence the work of those whose office it is to direct the higher affairs of such favored land is comparatively easy. The form of government takes care of itself, at least to a great extent, and the energies of statesmanship can be directed to the development of the resources of the community. Far different was the origin of our Constitution, and hence far more difficult was the achievement of our statesmen. Ours had its origin in the will of the people. The men who met in 1787 to frame a constitution and to establish a Government for the country had to build from the foundation and to combine within themselves the qualities both of political master-workmen and of statesmen. They were political architects, and they yet higher wisdom of political seers who were to propel vision far into the dim recesses of the future. They were, in another point of view, master-tailors, who were to cut the garment suitable for the anticipated use of the continent—to anticipate as far as human sagacity would allow how the way to develop as he would pass through the stages of infancy and youth to manhood. It was a difficult thing to do. It cannot be denied that the Fathers did their work with a regard for well-ordered liberty—with a wisdom and a grandeur of conception that has commanded the admiration of the world. But if the political edifices that they constructed were a grand structure, grand were the materials which they had at their command and with which they were to do their work. Other statesmen in forming governments have had units of individuals to be shaped into political form, but the statesmen of our revolutionary era had units of States—seventeen States—each the peer of the others, without regard to population strength or material wealth. With States for material, with the wholesome dread of consolidated power and consequent tyranny to restrain them, no wonder that they devised a scheme of government the like of which we may in vain search for in the past of the human race. What the character and style of it was? What the character and style of the house that our political Fathers built? "Ours," says Calhoun, "is a system of Government compounded of the separate Governments of the several States composing the Union, and of one common Government of all its members, called the Government of the United States. That is, our governmental system consists of the General Government on the one hand, and on the other, of the State Governments—the former created by the latter. Each of the States is a sovereign State, and the responsibility of the rulers of the United States, and each framed by written constitutions, and each dividing the powers of government into legislative, executive and judicial. Between the two were divided all the powers of government; those of a more general character being specifically assigned to the United States; and those not delegated, being reserved to the several States in their separate character, nor was there subordination of one part to the other. Each within its proper sphere was made sovereign and independent. No power was conferred without the other—the two combined making one entire and symmetrical Government. Hence ours, further, was designed to be a Republic of Republics. Our Government was formed a unit, not of individuals, but a grand unit of States. But it did not stand alone. It was made a part of a system of governments—the two Governments, standing as respects their powers in the relation of parts to the whole, and as respects their organization, in the relation of co-ordinates. Nor were the means wanting for preserving the division of power between the several departments of the Government. An examination of the Constitution shows the admirable means provided not only for this, but also for preserving the division of power between the delegated and the reserved powers—and thus far ensuring the preservation of the mutual negative or the concurrent principle, which is of the essence of the Government as one constitutional in its form. The General Government being paramount in the sphere of its delegated powers, and the State Governments being sovereign and paramount as regards the reserved powers, it follows that the co-ordinate governments, when disagreeing as to the extent of their respective powers, were intended to have and did have a mutual negative. It is not necessary to enter into a detailed account of this mutual negative in its exercise, or to discuss its political or legal consequences. The framers of the Constitution, anticipating that time and experience would devote the necessity for changes in the organic law or for modifications of the machinery of the Government, wisely gave, in the article of the sword of revolution, the power of amendment to the States. Three-fourths of the States in convention may invoke the great amending power and thus alter the governmental garment so as to adapt it to the development of the community. Thus the Constitution provided for the creative power to become the conserving power of the system. It is for the sovereign States to preserve it unimpaired so as to make its continuance not inconsistent with the power of the Government on the one hand and on the other with the liberty of the citizen and the sovereignty of the State—the circle of its reserved powers. Grand, then, it appears, was the scheme of our Government of Governments as designed by the Authors. It finds its counterpart only in the solar system which Astronomy unfolds to the mind's eye. The General Government may be likened to the central sun revolving upon its axis, and at the same time keeping within its respective orbits the numerous suns representing the States, moving each on its own poles and at the same time revolving round the central luminary. Nor is the analogy yet complete. As the central sun by virtue of its centrifugal force keeps the attendant suns in their respective orbits, preventing them from rushing madly into space, and as the attendant suns by virtue of their centrifugal force prevent themselves from being absorbed within the interior luminary and thus becoming extinct; so the Federal Government, by the centrifugal force of its State Governments, and so do the State Governments act upon the Federal Government, each by virtue of its restraining influence preserving its own integrity and the integrity of the other. The one prevents the tendency to disintegration; the other prevents the tendency to consolidation. And thus when the just influence of each is respected, and the system allowed to operate as it was designed in the beginning, the result is harmony; and the music of the spheres is not confined to the divine arrangement in the sidereal system.

## DOUBTFUL INDIANA.

DESIGNATION OF BOTH SIDES TO WIN.

The Republicans' Programme. Grant Aborn at Barnum's Strategy—Republican Efforts and Resources Wasted—An Earnest Call for More Money to Size Up With the Correspondence of the Philadelphia Times.

The leaders of both sides have got down to business and hard work in Indiana, and the Republicans to-day openly confess, for the first time, that Chairman Jewell has been utterly out-generaled in Indiana. They know that Indiana is naturally a Democratic State; that it elected Hendricks Governor in 1873; that it gave 17,000 Democratic majority in 1874; 5,500 in 1876 and 14,000 in 1878, and they now see the vanity and folly of Jewell's "splendid dress parade" begun by himself in Indiana more than two months ago, and followed up by a lavish waste of money, parades, speeches and enforced enthusiasm long before the people were ready to take part in the contest. Assessments and double assessments on the office-holders were called for and poured into Indiana before money could effect any lasting good, while English sat idly on his hands and waited for his opponents to exhaust themselves. Barnum slipped out to Indianapolis soon after Jewell had exhibited on the tree and told how the State was to be carried with a hurrah, and none knew that he came but English. They met, and the Republicans exhaust their money and enthusiasm, devised the most complete system for reaching every individual voter of the State by actual canvass, and decided to wait until three weeks before the election and then go in with all their resources. No money was scattered around for fire-works or parades; but the canvass was made as a matter of business by English, paid for out of his own pocket, and every weak voter and weak point of the Republican line is before English to guide him in putting his reserve powers into the struggle "where they will do the most good."
