Prohibition in Charlotte.

At the recent municipal election in Charlotte, the prohibitionists elected their candidate for mayor by twentyfive majority, and carried two out of the four wards. Colonel Johnston ran about sixty votes ahead of his ticket, so that the net prohibition majority for aldermen was about ninety. As the board of aldermen was a tie, the antiprohibitionists boasted that their six aldermen would refuse to qualify, and thus prevent a quorum in the council and a cause defeat of prohibition. Thereupon, Mayor De Wolfe, instead of calling upon the new board to qualify, called a meeting of the old members, and in a few hours they passed three ordinances which close up the liquor traffic in Charlotte at once, provides for a refunding of money to those holding unexpired licenses, and prevents the sale of all liquors, alcoholic bitters or fauits by bar-rooms or drug stores, under severe penalties. An effort was made to give time for the liquor dealers to get rid of their stock; but the prohibitionists, exasperated by the proposed obstruction policy of their opponents, took the bit in their teeth and refused to give a day. Considerable excitement prevails, but as the law allows five days for the new council to qualify, during which time the old council holds over, the ordinances of the retiring council would seem to be regular and of fall force and effect. Time will show whether this prohibition will prohibit.
