Fourth Class Postmaster Examination

Saturday, March 28, 1914—The United States Civil Service Commission announces that on the date named above an examination will be held at Cheraw, S. C., as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourth class postmaster at Patrick, S. C., and other vacancies as they may occur at that office, unless it shall be decided in the interests of the service to fill the vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$451 for the last fiscal year.

State where woman are declared by statute to be of full age for all purposes at 18 years, woman 18 years of age on the date of the examination will be admitted. Applicants must reside within the territory supplied by the post office for which the examination is announced. The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who can comply with the requirements. Application forms and full information concerning the requirements of the examination can be secured from the postmaster at Patrick, S. C., or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D.
