

#### Clio Company's License Revoked; Hoarding Charge

Washington, Jan. 30 .- The license of the Clio Oil & Fertilizer Co., of Clio, S. C., has been re voked and the concern ordered to close up its business not later than February 6, the food admin istration announced today. 'Speculation in, and hoarding cottonseed," is the reason given for the order, and it was announced that as all of the company's products are manufactured from cottonseed, which is under license, it will be unable to operate even as a fertilizer nanufacturer.

The company had on hand 3,-James Steen, Mt. Croghan. 0.2,000 pounds of cottonseed, and had been operated only two and a half days in the past year. according to statistics brought out at a hearing before the tedi food administration eral
