...THE DEMAND FOR THE WORLD FOR JUTE. The demand for the world for jute may be seen at a glance. It is valued for cotton, linen and silk. It is a material of twisted straw carpeting and low priced broadcloth. Single or mixed, it enters into the manufacture of a thousand articles of commerce. It makes hags of all kinds and gunny cloth for bagging cotton. The demand then being immense grain and cotton crops, immense. There are also important incidental advantages of this article. Its vigorous growth exterminates weeds from the soil, while the bitterness of its juice repels the attack of insects. "It has been found that cotton fields surrounded by a belt of jute were free from the depredations of the caterpillar, while unprotected fields in the same neighborhood suffered from its ravages." Prof. Waterhouse shows by actual figures that the profit on jute in the United States has been very large, and says in conclusion "no vigor of language can too earnestly express my conviction that the production of vast quantities, now available from Southern enterprise." It would be well for our farmers to look into the matter. They will get all the information as to the mode of culture and the machinery needed for working it up by reference to the report of Prof. Waterhouse.

...A DESTRUCTIVE CYCLONE. The storm which visited our State last Monday night, has done considerable damage in other parts of the country, as the following dispatches show: NEW ORLEANS, April 23.—A frightful cyclone passed over Wesson and the town of Beauregard, two towns in Mississippi, Tuesday night.
