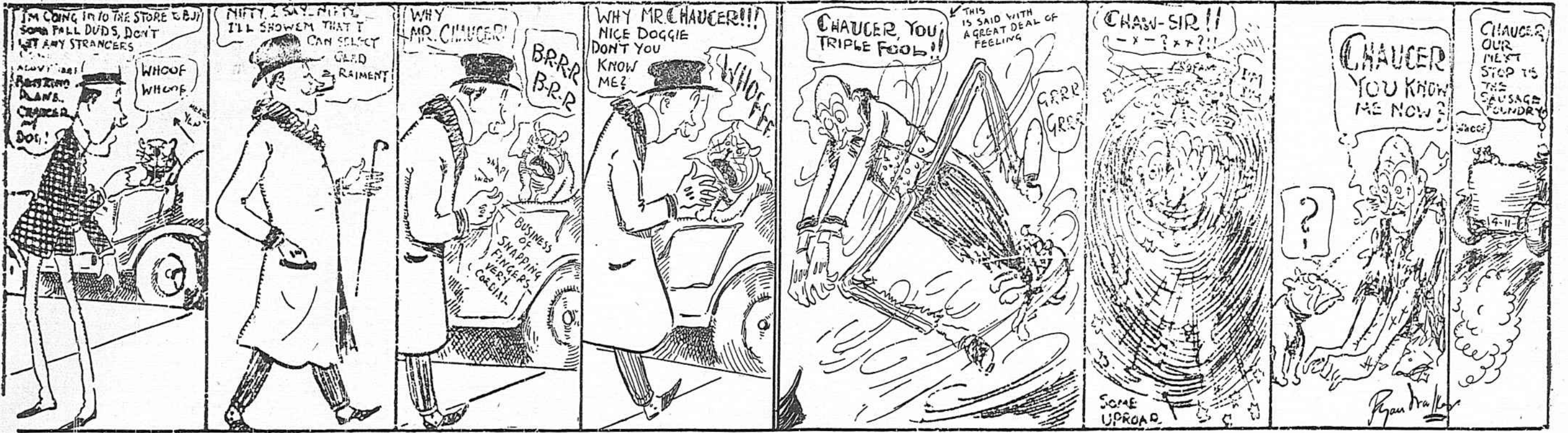

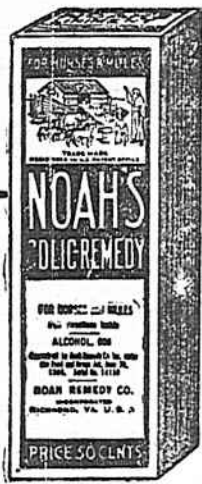

Steam-Kissed Oranges.

The final ripening process in the preparation of California oranges for the market is the exposure of the fruit to steam vapor, which imparts the golden yellow color described on the labels by "sun kissed" and other appetizing terms. Electric heat is employed to a large extent in producing this steam vapor, electric immersion coils in open tanks of water in the ripening rooms producing the warm humidity required to give the final tint to the orange of commerce.—Dietetic and Hygienic Gazette.

That Deadly Parlor Rifle.

A very sad and distressing accident occurred over in Sumter on Wednesday, which resulted in the death of Mrs. W. J. Benjamin, a young married lady, who leaves a husband and four little children. Mrs. Benjamin was tidying her home on west Hampton Avenue, and in some manner knocked over a 22 calibre parlor rifle. The rifle discharged and the ball entered Mrs. Benjamin's neck, under the chin, death resulting in a few seconds. There are scores of homes in Orangeburg county, where a similar accident may happen any day by the knocking over of the deadly parlor rifle carelessly left in some corner. THEIR APPETITES WITH THEM

2 1/2 Pounds of Meat and 12 Quarts of Strong Drink Per Capita Is French Record.

Frenchmen are pretty able trenchermen, but the following account of a meal made by eight Norman peasants surpasses expectations. According to the Medical Journal, a grazier with seven of his friends undertook an expedition to gather fagots.

Among them they should have managed some 400 fagots, but 37 represented the sum of their work, the small total being accounted for, possibly by the luncheon which the octet devoured. They managed to consume 20 pounds of meat, 8 quarts of pure perry, 16 bottles of assorted wines, 9 bottles of champagne and 8 quarts of cider brandy of an alcoholic strength of 65 per cent. A roast goose, placed thoughtfully among the rations, was not required.

This luncheon represents an average of 2 1/2 pounds of meat and 12 quarts of milk, none of it weak, per capita during the 12 hours occupied by the expedition.
